Marion reported the expenditures for the 2003 year. The banquet cost a total of \$1745.03 for space rental and 52 dinners. The banquet costs are nearly self-sustaining except for the cost of door prizes. The summer tour of 2003 had fewer people than the 2002 summer tour. We are setting aside \$900.00 for the 2004 summer tour. By starting the planning earlier we hope to get better pricing for the booklets. Our estimated income is \$1600.00. The newsletter will be posted on our web site for reading and/or downloading. Those who have no access to our web site will continue to have the newsletter by mail.

This will save on printing and postage expenses. It was noted that Bill Layman and Chris Rohrs will be helping Allan Warrior with the newsletter. Because the February GATS will fall on Valentine's day we have decided to not participate. We will ask for \$300.00 to participate in the November GATS.

We have set aside a budget amount of \$250.00 to participate in the Yard, Garden & Patio Show. Our layout will be part of a nursery display and we looked at plans for the display. The trains will be running on the nursery display and we will have a 10X10 foot static display nearby. We will build the sub-roadbed ahead of time.

Our new web site, **rcgrs.com**, will cost \$14.95 a month. We will pay Allan S. Warrior, Allan's son, a total of \$500.00 for setting up the web site (\$250 from 2003 budget). Dennis Peoples will Email him to ask about the cost of maintenance of the site.

A committee is to be formed to plan for a modular layout. Jeff Lange has volunteered to help. Anyone else interested in this effort should contact him. It was noted that the club should pay for any expenses Chuck Weber has when he hosts the annual RCGRS open house/auction/business meeting. It was also suggested that we need to review the RCGRS Rules of Etiquette for open houses.
